Subject:- Formulation of Annual Action Plan (AAP) for the year 2019-20 under NRDWP and its submission thereof.

Government of India's vide letter No. w- 11039/1/2019-water-I dated. 01/01/2019, has desired for preparation/submission of Annual Action Plan 2019-20 as per the instruction given in letter (copy enclosed for ready reference) the priority shall be given as:-

Priority I. 100% physically completed but financially incomplete.

Priority II. More than 75% but less than 100% physically complete.

Priority IV. More than 25% but less than 50% physically complete.

Priority IV. More than 25% but less than 50% physically complete.

V. Priority For the schemes which are less than 25% completed, state needs to complete them on their own budget.

In this connection you are advised to formulate the schematic Annual Action Plan 2019-20 strictly for ongoing schemes as per the format C30 of IMIS, the copy of formats along with format of AAP for ongoing Schemes 2019-20 is also enclosed. The preparation of Schematic AAP and Formats is to be submitted to this office before 6th Feb 2019, so that schematic entry will be updated. The formats shall be duly filled and signed by the Executive Engineer of the concerned divisions as per instruction given in the letter.

Dear Madam / Sir,

You are aware that under National Rural Drinking Water Programme (NRDWP), States / UTs will have to plan the activities, coverage and finance for each year taking into consideration the ongoing schemes, new schemes and link to the habitations which are proposed to be covered through these schemes during that financial year. Once this is finalized for the year 2019-20, it is to be cleared in the State Level Scheme Sanctioning Committee (SLSSC).

- 1. The Annual Action Plan 2019-20 for NRDWP may please be submitted by 15/02/2019 as per format (which would be made available by 25.01.2019) in IMIS. Presentations on AAP formats and other issues stated in the subsequent paras would be made by the States in AAP meetings (which will be held in February-March, 2019 as per the **Annexure**).
- 2. Plan Size: For this purpose, over and above anticipated opening balance, allocation under Coverage component in 2019-20 may be taken as 25% higher than initial notional allocation of 2018-19. However the quantum of funds required for completing unfinished projects should be first taken into account. The physical targets should be fixed based only on available funds for the financial year 2019-20.

3. AAP formats:

- a) Progress on ongoing PWS schemes (taken up under all components of NRDWP)
- b) Coverage in terms of habitations
- c) Support activities
- d) WQM&S activities
- e) PWSS progress monitoring
- f) Geo-tagging
- g) Financial planning
- h) Finance (other than NRDWP)
- i) 0&M
- j) Swajal Project
- k) NWQSM

4. Other issues to be discussed in AAP meeting:

- a) Progress on AAP discussions of 2018-19 (copy available on website)
- b) Issues / Problems (if any) in implementation during 2018-19
- 1) Issues regarding UCs and Audited Statement of Accounts
- m) Best and Innovative practices adopted

5. Plan for Coverage:

a) While marking the scheme in entry formats of AAP, states are required to progress the schemes which are at higher stage of completion otherwise justifiable reasons may be mentioned.

- b) Priorities are to be accorded to the schemes meant for Arsenic / Fluoride affected habitation or schemes in SAGY GP / Declared ODF villages / Aspirational districts.
- c) The schemes having physical progress less than 25 % needs to be completed from State's own budget until there is relaxation given from MDWS.
- d) While planning and executing PWSS, the provision for Public Stand post connection to the vicinity of Government schools, Government anganwadis, Community / local body buildings may be made and connections may be provided as per the State's policy.
- e) To ensure the availability of potable drinking water on sustainable basis in SC/ST concentrated habitations, the State/UTs are required to earmark at least 22% of the NRDWP funds for drinking water supply to the SC concentrated habitations and another minimum 10% for the ST concentrated habitations. In cases where, the States have achieved full coverage of SC/ST concentrated habitations, such States/UTs may be taken up augmentation schemes in the SC/ST habitations to raise service levels. Where the percentage of SC or ST population in a particular State or the existing coverage of SC/ST concentrated habitations warrants earmarking/ utilization of more than stipulated provisions, additional funds should also be utilized. The list of such SC and ST concentrated habitations is indicated in the MDWS website.
- f) Priority in coverage should also be given to minority concentrated habitations in the 116 minority-concentrated districts identified by the Ministry of Minority Affairs, Government of India which is also indicated in the MDWS website.
- g) The districts covered under Integrated Action Plan (affected by Left Wing Extremism) and with predominant tribal population as per the Government of India list which is also available in MDWS web-site should be given higher per capita allocation and release of funds.
- 6. Plan for JE-AES (only for the concerned States): This may also be planned as that of coverage anticipating 25% higher allocation over initial notional allocation of 2018-19.
- Plan for NWQSM and RWSSP-LIS (only for the concerned States): As per the respective guidelines and decisions taken in Apex Committee and Steering Committee / Monthly Review.
- 8. Support Activities: This would be limited to 5% of the expenditure planned under coverage component in 2019-20. All support activity including HRD, training, IEC, MIS, Computerization, M&E, R&D should get adequate attention.
- WQM&S activities: This would be limited to 5% of the expenditure planned under coverage component in 2019-20. All WQM&S activity should get adequate attention while following National Drinking Water Quality Protocol.
- 10. Jalmani, Calamity and NCEF: States must submit the final UC along with ASA (if not submitted yet). In case of any unspent balance with them, the same may be refunded to MDWS by March-April, 2019.
- 11. **O&M**: Although this is not covered under NRDWP, State must ensure this essential activity through their own resources.

- 12. **Recharge structures:** Although this is not covered under NRDWP, State must ensure this essential activity through their own resources or convergence from other Central or State programme.
- 13. The State should tentatively indicate the finance to be made available to each district. Then each district should plan for progressing of the schemes and coverage of habitations with the same. This exercise should start immediately after receipt of this letter and entry in this respect in IMIS should start from 01.02.2019. The State may modify the district plan before approving the same. This exercise must be completed two days before the AAP meeting scheduled for the respective State.
- 14. To familiarize the States regarding planning and entry in AAP formats, a two days workshop on 28th-29th January, 2019 has been planned. Secretary, Rural Water Supply, Chief Engineer and the IMIS coordinators / officer (familiar with making entry in various IMIS formats) of all the States / UTs should attend this workshop, venue of which will be intimated in due course.
- 15. A video conference will also be arranged on <u>31.01.2019</u> with all the States to discuss the doubts/difficulties in this respect.

The States / UTs are required to adhere to the AAP schedule.
